

This Nodwel is being used to access the Right of Way on the transmission line between North Caribou Lake and Muskrat Dam First Nations. The Nodwell is a multi-purpose two-tracked vehicle that can travel not just across snow, but in conditions like sand, mud, muskeg and swamp!



Foundation masts on site. These will be used as foundations to support substation steel columns and electrical equipment. The bottom plate is attached to grouted rock anchors. The crews then backfill around the mast and weld a plate to cap the mast.



Wataynikaneyap Substation Construction Progress






