- Communication





Laura is a member of Kitchenuhmaykoosib Inninuwug (KI). She is the proud mother of five children and grandmother to eight grandchildren. She currently resides in Thunder Bay. Laura is a graduate of Lakehead University and in her personal time she is a language teacher and has been teaching for over ten years at the Fort William First Nation.

In 2019, Laura joined the OSLP team as Training Program Coordinator and in 2021 Laura was promoted to the position of Training Program Manager. In her current role, Laura is responsible for planning, designing and implementing training programs that meet the workforce needs of the Wataynikaneyap Transmission Line Project. She works closely with a training team that provides support to training program activities. Together with the team, Laura has successfully delivered 51 training programs with over 600 trainees (which includes trainees that had taken more than one training program). The graduation rate is over 90%. The training team takes pride in the accomplishments achieved to date.

Laura has been successful in building Indigenous Knowledge and Land Based Learning into the curriculum of every training program. The curriculum has been successful in supporting trainees to become culturally competent professionals in their respective fields of learning and employment. Laura firmly believes that blending Indigenous knowledge with western knowledge provides for multifaceted knowledge which includes local community Indigenous sciences; social, economic, and philosophical learned that is grounded in spirituality, practices, and ways of being in the natural world.

Laura's work in life has focused on Indigenous youth and young adults. For over 30 years she has worked to train and pass on Indigenous knowledge and cultural ways to the younger generation. Laura earned her knowledge of protocols and ceremonies from the ancestors and lodge keepers she has worked with as a helper and translator. She continues with her lifelong work to learn and pass on Indigenous teachings. Laura credits her knowledge to the ancestors and Knowledge Keepers that have passed on the living memory of Indigenous ways.

Laura is fond of storytelling and humour. She looks forward to the energization of the PFNs and is inspired to move forward to support the communities accomplish the vision of ownership in 25 years.
